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Pulmonary artery sling (PAS) is a rare congenital vascular anomaly with variable clinical presentations. Dr KI Ip reported an interesting case of a 4-month-old baby boy who initially presented as viral laryngotracheobronchitis and was subsequently diagnosed to have left pulmonary artery sling (LPAS). The clinical presentations and management of this rare condition were reviewed.

Mr CK Fung, the awardee from the Chinese University of Hong Kong, presented a comprehensive review on various modalities of complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) for the treatment of allergic rhinitis, which is a common chronic disease affecting both adults and children worldwide. In addition, Mr Alex QY Liu, the awardee from the University of Hong Kong, reviewed the natural history and consequences of paediatric primary snoring, which is a common form of sleep disorder breathing among children in Hong Kong. Clinical outcomes such as cardiovascular, neurocognitive, and neurobehavioral health, as well as quality of life of the family were evaluated.
